After weeks of working remotely and searching for new office space, we are happy to report that the new CIS administrative office will be located at 3148 George II Highway, Unit 2 in Boiling Spring Lakes. After an ongoing search and a request through all Brunswick County Chambers of Commerce for donations of office equipment and supplies, the new space is being cleaned, painted, and getting ready to open. The CIS administration team is hoping to open the new office in December.

The new space is equipped with individual offices, a conference room, small kitchen area, and bathroom with an exterior offering of 22 parking spaces and a rear alleyway for deliveries. We are thankful for all of the businesses, community organizations, individuals, and neighbors that helped us with kindness and generosity donating office equipment and supplies for our new space. Reading Buddies make all the difference

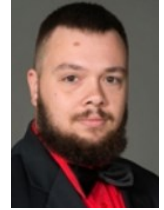

But the CIS Reading Buddy program at Supply Elementary School has students ready for the end of the day for a different reason. Kylan, Kaden, Kennedy, and PJ are students that have been bitten with the Reading Buddy bug and can't wait to spend time with their mentors afterschool.

Reading Buddy sessions are filled with adult volunteers helping with homework, Math and English/Spelling flash card work, and students reading aloud to volunteers. The students all say they love the program and wouldn't know what they would do without CIS and Reading Buddies! Kaden said, "It helps me with schoolwork. I didn't understand or like STEM stuff, now I like the STEM projects and Math is one of my favorite subjects!" PJ chimed in, "CIS is educational and good for students to get help learning many different subjects." Kennedy said while Math is her favorite, Reading is a close second. Her favorite part of Reading Buddies is "getting to read with an adult to listen and they help you." CIS Reading Buddies helps students improve reading, improve grades, and instills a love of reading.

Diana Fotinatos is one of the dedicated volunteers in the CIS Reading Buddy program. She has worked for four years with Supply Elementary 2nd – 5th grade students. Every Tuesday she can be found going over multiplication tables, flashcards, and serving as a reading partner. CIS Reading Buddies program assists struggling students and helps them complete homework afterschool when the most help is needed. Diana said that she is inspired to give back to students because of the past work done by her dog "Cosmo", a Cockapoo who spent years volunteering as a therapy dog. The "Tail Wagging Tutor", regularly volunteered with nursing home residents and school students in libraries. Diana gives back in his honor to help students improve and give back to her community. "When I see a child that was struggling with English to then go up a grade in reading, makes it all worth it!" exclaimed Diana.

Volunteer with CIS Peer Court and be the change in student lives

Do you have a few spare hours, one to two days per month? Do you want to make a difference in your community and the lives of local students? CIS needs compassionate people as volunteers that will change student lives in Brunswick County. Volunteers give back tirelessly to the community through CIS and help students in Brunswick County stay in school. Through CIS programs, volunteers help fulfill the CIS mission “to surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life”.

CIS provides the Action for Success Dropout Prevention Program in Cedar Grove Middle School, Leland Middle School, Shallotte Middle School, South Brunswick Middle School, Waccamaw School serving K-8, and Supply Elementary School incorporating community volunteers working with CIS Success Coaches to support students. CIS also provides Parenting Education Programs, 21st Century Community Learning Center (21st CCLC) afterschool program, Teen and Peer Court, with a major focus on dropout prevention.

Partnerships with Brunswick County Schools, the Brunswick County District Attorney’s Office, compassionate volunteers and community partners, help these programs serve over 4,000 students and families each year.

Currently, volunteers are especially needed in the CIS Peer Court program at Cedar Grove Middle School and Supply Elementary School. Peer Court is a CIS program provided in every Brunswick County middle school, Waccamaw School and Supply Elementary. Peer Court is an alternative system of justice, which offers first-time juvenile offenders ages 6-17 an opportunity to admit responsibility for their misdemeanor offenses and receive constructive sentencing from their peers.

Peer Court provides a “hands on” educational experience for student volunteers in an effort to help them better understand the justice system. Students volunteer and train to serve as attorneys, jurors, bailiffs, and clerks in court cases involving first-time juvenile offenders. Peer Court gives student defendants a “second chance” and the opportunity to avoid a juvenile court record if they participate in Peer Court and successfully complete all sentencing requirements. Without needed adult volunteer support, the Peer Court programs at Cedar Grove Middle School and Supply Elementary School will not be able to continue.

CIS spoke to Tracy Coston, Principal at Supply Elementary, about the Peer Court program and what it means for students. “We are excited to have the opportunity to bring Peer Court to our students at Supply Elementary. I am overjoyed that our students at Supply will be able to gain confidence through Peer Court that will lead them into future career choices and other endeavors.” Principal Justin Hayes at Cedar Grove Middle School shared how the CIS Peer Court program impacts his students. “Peer Court does a great job bringing in community volunteers to engage in conversation and work with our at-risk students at Cedar Grove. Peer Court also allows student volunteers, who are interested in the judicial system, the opportunity to participate in a modified court proceeding that will further their excitement. I am glad CIS Peer Court is a part of Cedar Grove Middle School,” said Principal Hayes.

Peer Court cases are heard one afternoon each month at school, immediately following the regular school day. As a new school semester is starting soon, please give of your time to help change a student’s life in Brunswick County. Adult volunteers are needed right away to keep this program operating successfully at Cedar Grove Middle and Supply Elementary. CIS Incredible Years Parenting Program (IY) is taking place in Southport, Shallotte, and Bolivia. The Southport program is at Trinity United Methodist Church, 209 E. Nash St.; Shallotte’s classes are held at Shallotte Presbyterian Church, 5070 Main Street; and the Bolivia class is held at Hope Harbor Home. The first few class sessions focus on positive things parents can do to receive positive behaviors from children, then later sessions move on to techniques to decrease children’s negative behaviors.

The IY program has 13 participants in current classes! One participant said IY allowed Special Time with her daughter, and her daughter would even help with chores after Special Time without being asked. Another participant said, “I really appreciate the way that we are able to be open in any discussions about the material being covered relative to our interactions with our respective families and get support from each other.” New classes will begin February 4, in Leland, February 5 in Shallotte, and at Jessie Mae Monroe School in the spring.
